



## Whānau Resilience Kaimahi

1.0 FTE – 40 hours per week

We are seeking a Kaimahi to help support Whānau in the South Waikato district. Network, engage and co-design services with Whānau, for Whānau. Based in Tokoroa

The Kaimahi role is for someone who has existing connections across the South Waikato, and who has a passion to support Whānau to live violence free and to eliminate violence for the next generation. The successful applicant will be working as part of a larger team of social service kaimahi within the South Waikato district, Mangakino and Whakamaru.

The Kaimahi role will involve working with local groups of providers, Whānau, and agencies to design services to meet the unique needs of our region. This design process will take up to one year and involve working together to build a picture of the needs and strengths of our region, along with testing and learning about what works for Whānau to build resilience. Although service design experience would be beneficial, the Kaimahi will be well supported by a Pouwhakataki who will help guide them through the design process.

Essential qualifications and experience:

- Excellent relationship management and communication skills
- Experience in working with whānau affected by family violence (essential)
- Knowledge and understanding of Tikanga Māori and Kaupapa Māori service delivery
- Confidence to work within the South Waikato district to make a difference
- Ideally, a qualification in Social or Health Sector
- Good computer skills
- A full driver's licence
